About the Course:

This programme is designed to develop **adaptive leadership capabilities** among women officers in public service, with a focus on navigating complex, evolving and uncertain governance environments.

Rather than focusing on prescriptive leadership models, the programme emphasises the ability to **diagnose challenges, work across institutional boundaries, engage with diverse stakeholders and lead change in real-world contexts**. Participants will explore how to respond to competing priorities, manage ambiguity and build effective working relationships within public systems.

The course is anchored in **experiential and reflective learning**, enabling participants to develop self-awareness, resilience and practical leadership responses that can be applied within their own institutional settings.

Through structured discussions and peer interaction, the programme provides a platform for women officers to share experiences and build professional networks across countries.

It is designed for women officers in mid- to senior-level roles in government organisations, particularly those involved in enforcement, regulatory or governance functions.

Who Should Apply:

Women officers serving in government organisations at mid- to senior-level positions particularly those involved in supervisory, managerial or policy roles.

About the Course:

This programme focuses on key trade facilitation tools used by Customs administrations to balance efficient clearance with effective risk management.

Participants will be introduced to the concepts and operational aspects of Authorized Economic Operator (AEO) programmes, Mutual Recognition Arrangements (MRAs) and Time Release Studies (TRS). The course will examine how these tools contribute to secure supply chains, improved compliance and reduced clearance times.

The programme will also provide insights into implementation challenges, inter-agency coordination and the role of international cooperation in facilitating trade.

Through case discussions and practical examples, participants will gain an understanding of how these measures can be adapted to different administrative contexts.

The course is intended for officials from Customs, trade ministries, port authorities and other government agencies involved in border management and trade facilitation.

ITEC Training Program on Trade Facilitation with focus on e-commerce, FTAs and Risk Management

About the Course:

The rapid growth of cross-border e-commerce and evolving global trade patterns have introduced new challenges for Customs administrations. This programme aims to equip officials with an understanding of these changes and their implications for border management.

The course will examine the operational impact of high-volume, low-value consignments, digital trade platforms and complex logistics networks. It will also introduce participants to key aspects of Free Trade Agreements (FTAs), particularly in relation to compliance and facilitation.

A central theme of the programme is risk management, including how administrations can target high-risk consignments while facilitating legitimate trade.

Through case discussions and practical examples, the programme will highlight approaches for adapting Customs procedures to emerging trade environments.

The course is intended for officials from Customs administrations, postal authorities, trade ministries and other government agencies involved in trade facilitation and border regulation.

- Officers from other government agencies involved in border management and trade facilitation
- Personnel engaged in policy or regulatory functions

ITEC Training Program on Illegal Wildlife Trafficking, CMAA, CEN and Risk Management



(16th November, 2026- 27th November, 2026)

About the Course:

Illegal wildlife trade continues to pose significant challenges to biodiversity, environmental protection and border enforcement systems. This programme aims to strengthen the capacity of enforcement agencies to address wildlife trafficking through improved understanding and coordinated action.

The course will examine trafficking patterns, commonly used concealment methods and the role of organised networks in illegal wildlife trade. Participants will also be introduced to relevant international frameworks, including CITES, and the operational role of Customs and border agencies. A key focus of the programme will be on intelligence-led enforcement and the use of cooperation mechanisms among national and international agencies.

The programme adopts a practical orientation through case-based discussions and examples, enabling participants to relate learning to field situations. It is suitable for officers from Customs, police, wildlife and environmental enforcement agencies and other government departments involved in combating wildlife crime.

ITEC Training Program on Anti-Money Laundering and Countering the Financing of Terrorism (AML/CFT) with emphasis on Trade based Money Laundering (TBML) and Customs-led Investigations



(03rd February, 2027 - 09th February, 2027)

National Academy of Customs, Indirect Taxes & Narcotics (NACIN),

About the Course:

This specialised programme focuses on strengthening the capacity of enforcement and regulatory agencies to detect and respond to money laundering and terrorist financing, particularly in the context of international trade and narcotics-linked financial flows.

Illicit financial activities increasingly exploit legitimate trade channels through practices such as mis-invoicing, misuse of logistics chains and complex value transfer mechanisms. The programme will examine these patterns, with particular emphasis on trade-based money laundering (TBML) and the interface between Customs enforcement and financial investigations.

Participants will be introduced to key risk indicators, typologies, and institutional frameworks, including the role of Financial Intelligence Units (FIUs), regulators and enforcement agencies. The course will also cover international cooperation mechanisms relevant to cross-border financial crime.

The programme adopts a practical approach through case discussions and guided exercises, enabling participants to relate concepts to operational contexts. It is designed for officers from Customs, police, investigative agencies, regulators and other government departments engaged in financial crime and illicit trade

- Officers from Financial Intelligence Units (FIUs) and financial regulators
- Personnel from government departments dealing with financial crime, illicit trade, or economic offences
- Officials engaged in investigation, intelligence, regulatory, or supervisory functions
